After suitable greetings - and I still don't know how it was arranged, but I presume suitable words were exchanged between the two COs and the two Matrons - I soon found myself going ashore to spend the time we were to be in Morotai with my old Unit.

It was a most warming experience, as I was made feel very welcome - I felt as if I was coming home, especially when I found I was to share a tent with my former tentmates Bon Aveling and Dulcie Deacon. I remember waking up the first night, and being quite certain I had imbibed too well - as across the dirt floor I could seen an upturned wash basin moving at quite a steady pace.

On wakening Bon and Dulcie, I was reassured that it was only a land crab caught under the basin!!

The time passed all too quickly, and it was I think on the third day that I was returned to the *Manunda* for the onward trip to Balikpapan.

I doubt whether Colonel Murray or Matron Cook ever realised how much pleasure and happiness they had given me, and continue to do so. It may be this type of example, set by them, which has been responsible for the great comradeship that exists in the Unit.
